- 3. Compare and contrast Jesus' "commission" to the women in 28:10 and the disciples in 28:18-20.
- 4. How does Jesus' promise of His presence motivate the work of making disciples?

APPLICATION QUESTIONS

- 1. How does Jesus;' victory over death shape your understanding of salvation and hope?
- 2. How can we graciously respond to those who have doubts of Jesus' resurrection, or are outright hostile to the gospel?
- 3. How does recognizing Jesus' authority over all things affect your obedience to His commands, including the Great Commission? How can you submit to His Lordship in your daily life?
- 4. How can we prioritize evangelism, baptism, teaching, and discipleship in our Community Group?
