Introduction

According to the apostle Peter, God will bring his justice even if it seems delayed to us (3:1–13). As we continue through chapter three, we'll be exhorted to stay diligent in our faith. In a world where truth can be twisted, we'll uncover how to remain steadfast, grow spiritually, and live in a way that reflects our hope in Christ.

Study Questions Read 2 Peter 3:14 - 18

- 1. What does it mean to "be diligent to be found by Him without spot or blemish" (v. 14)?
- 2. How does Peter describe those who twist Scripture (v. 16)?
- 3. How does Peter's final warning reinforce the letter's message (v. 17)?
- 4. Why is growing in grace and knowledge of Christ essential to our faith (v. 18)?

Application Questions

- 1. Does being diligent in our faith undermine the message of salvation by grace alone? Why or why not?
- 2. What does "gospel-motivated" diligence look like in our lives?
- 3. How do we avoid twisting Scripture?
- 4. How can we encourage one another to grow in the "grace and knowledge of our Lord Jesus Christ"?
